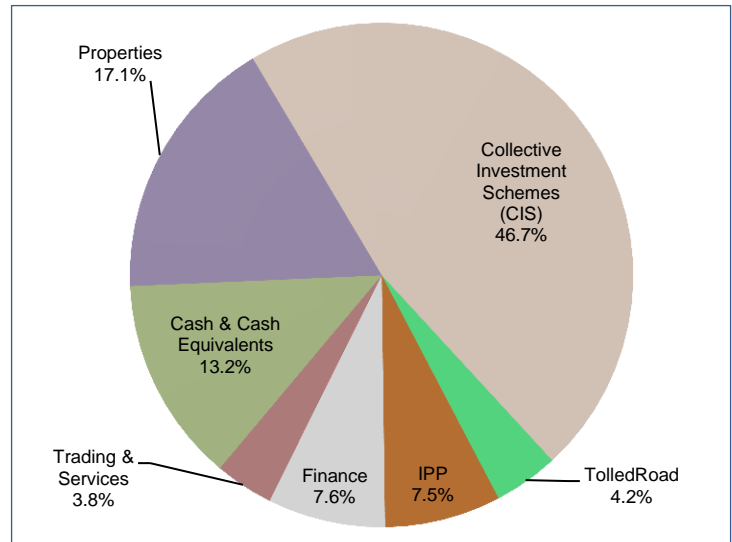

The Fund aim to provide Qualified Investors with relatively steady income and moderate capital appreciation over a Short to Medium-Term by investing in Fixed Income Investments.



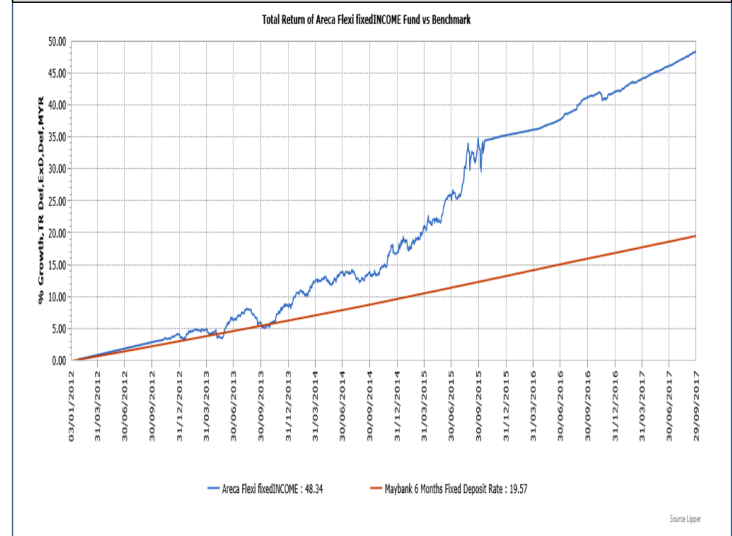
## ASSET & SECTOR ALLOCATION (% OF NAV)

## FUND'S PERFORMANCE COMPARED TO BENCHMARK



Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 31 August 2017, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 3.6 and is classified as "Low" (source: Lipper). "Low" includes funds with VF that are above 1.870 but not more than 6.225 (source: Lipper). The VF means there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six months. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display their VF and VC.
