FUND MANAGER'S REPORT



The Federal Reserve kept rates unchanged at the end of January. However, accompanying statement by new Federal Reserve chairman Jerome Powell emphasising robust labour market, strong consumer spending and accelerating wage growth was deemed hawkish. The market took it to hint four rather than three rate hikes for the year albeit a gradual rise. Bond traders sold off Treasuries breaking above 2.80% for the 10-year benchmark, a level last seen 4 years ago. Dow Jones lost more than 10% from the all-time high at one point as a result.

Following Overnight Policy Rate (OPR) hike in January in Malaysia, bonds faced bearish environment but yields rose no more than 10 basis points (bps) across the board at longer end of curve.

FUND OBJECTIVE



Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 31 January 2018, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 2.2 and is classified as "Low" (source: Lipper). "Low" includes funds with VF that are above 1.785 but not more than 6.045 (source: Lipper). The VF means there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six months. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display their VF and VC.
